- Eligibility:** Swimmers who are members of SNC or are associated with a World Aquatics affiliated country are eligible. There are no qualifying standards.
- Entries:** Hy-tek entries will be accepted via SNC web upload only.
- Entries will be limited to the first 250 received.
- Entry in the 800m Freestyle and the 400 Individual Medley will be limited to swimmers who have a previous times (ie. NTs will not be restricted from entering these events)
- Deck entries will NOT be accepted.**
- Meet management will not accept any request for official split times.**
- Meet Management reserves the right to:
- Close entries prior to the deadline in the event of oversubscription.
  - Change warm-up and session times or change event order to ensure reasonable session timelines
- Event Entry Limits:** Swimmers may swim up to 6 individual events plus relays

**Entry Deadline:** June 12, 2025 at 24h00 AT. **Entries (individual and relays) will not be accepted after the deadline.** Once the entry file is uploaded, an email confirming the entries will be sent to the club. Once received, the club has **24 hours** to review this file and make corrections/modifications to entries. Entry time, event additions or change of events will not be accepted after this period.

**Entry Fees:** \$82.00 fee per swimmer. (\$12.00 Swim PEI fee + \$70.00 meet fee)

The amount due is based on the entries confirmed on June 14, 2026.  
Fees are due prior to warm-up on June 19, 2026.

**Meet Format:** All 50m and 100 m individual events will be swum as preliminaries and finals. All 50m and 100 m individual events will be swum as "Open" seeded during preliminaries and in the following age categories by gender for finals/awards/points: 12 & Under, 13-14, and 15 & Over. All 50m and 100 m individual events there will have A finals in each age group and gender.

All 200m, 400m and 800m individual events will be swum as Timed Finals. These events will be swum as "Open" seeded with results reported and awards/points given in the following age categories by gender: 12 & Under, 13-14, and 15 & Over.

A swimmer's age is determined as of the first day of the meet.

All relay events will be a Timed Finals for each age group and gender.

The 400m Freestyle, 400m Individual Medley and 800m will be swum fastest to slowest alternating genders if there is more than one heat

The meet program will be available on Meet Mobile, if feasible.

Results will be available 24 hours after the meet barring any unforeseen circumstances.

**Scratches:** Scratches are to be submitted to the **Meet Manager in the Multi-Purpose Room** no later than **30 minutes** after the start of warm-up of each session.

There shall be a \$15.00 penalty for scratches made after the scratch deadline for Timed Finals and Finals.

This penalty shall apply to all step-downs, no-shows, and unexcused incomplete swims for Timed Finals and Finals. (Unexcused incomplete swims shall be the sole determination of the Referee).

The penalty must be paid prior to the swimmer in question swimming again in the meet. Fines incurred on the final day of competition and not collected, will be invoiced to the club. The invoice will include payment instructions.

**Relay Rules:** Each club is allowed to enter multiple relay teams per event number as long as they meet the following criteria:

1. At least two (2) of the four (4) members are qualified, entered, and swim in that age group.
2. Swimmers must not move to a younger age group (from which they are entered) to fill up the relay. However, a swimmer may move to an older age group.
3. All swimmers must be legally entered in the meet in an individual event.
4. A swimmer may only swim once per event number, with an event defined as an individual relay race assigned a specified number in the program and consisting of one or more heats.
5. Relay names for each relay team must be provided when entries are submitted.
6. Relay name changes will be accepted until 30 minutes before the start of each session.

**Scoring:** Individual Points:  
A Final: 20-17-16-15-14-13-12-11

Scores will be kept and Age Group Provincial Champions will be declared in the following age categories:

- 12&Under Female
- 13-14 Female
- 15&Over Female

**Awards:** Medals for 1<sup>st</sup>, 2<sup>nd</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> place in individual and relay events and ribbons for 4<sup>th</sup> through 8<sup>th</sup> place in individual events.

Note: Out of province swimmers are NOT eligible for “Age Group Provincial Champions”

**Meet package:** The only valid meet package is the most current one found on [www.swimming.ca](http://www.swimming.ca).

**Meet Rules:** Swimming Canada rules govern this competition. Competition Rules or procedures contained in this Meet Information package supersede those found within the Swimming Canada Rulebook. **Misconduct Provisions:**

Effective **September 1, 2026, Rule C.2.3.2.1 (Misconduct Provisions)** will be enforced. The rule, along with guidance on this rule for officials can be found below and in the Swimming Canada rulebook.

**2.3.2** The Starter shall report a swimmer to the Referee for delaying the start, for willfully disobeying an order or for any other misconduct taking place at the start, but only the Referee may disqualify a swimmer for such delay, willful disobedience or misconduct.

**C2.3.2.1** For the purposes of Rule II 2.3.2, “misconduct” shall include, but is not limited to:

- Deliberate or negligent acts such as spitting, spouting of water, or blowing the nose in the pool or on the pool deck immediately prior to the start may be considered misconduct.
  - Deliberate kicking or striking of the starting platform, including the back plate prior to the start.
  - Unsafe or uncontrolled entry into the pool immediately prior to the start of a race. All swimmers must enter the pool with a controlled, feet-first entry.

This update supports public health and facility hygiene standards as well as reducing facility/equipment damage and associated costs. From now through August 31, 2026, officials will apply an education-first approach – using calm reminders and warnings and penalizing only clear, deliberate acts (not incidental spray, coughing, or normal block foot adjustments).

**Starts:** Starts in freestyle, breaststroke, butterfly and individual medley races will be conducted from the Starting Platforms (blocks) as per SNC 4.

Backstroke ledges are available for use.

**Safety & Liability:** Swimming Canada and Swim PEI believe that athletes, coaches, officials, support staff and volunteers have the right to participate in a safe and inclusive sport environment that is free of abuse, harassment and discrimination. Access to the pool deck is only for registered participants of the event. All members on the pool deck must be registered with a club, PSO, or Swimming Canada

**Open and Observable Environment:**

Swimming Canada and Swim PEI is dedicated to providing a safe and inclusive environment, which involves promoting Open and Observable Environments. This means making meaningful and concerted efforts to avoid situations where a coach/official/staff member, etc. might be alone with an athlete. All interactions between an athlete and an individual who is in a position of trust should normally, and wherever possible, be in an environment or space that is both 'open' and 'observable' to others.

**Photography/Videography:**

- a. In order to minimize risk, all photographs and video taken at Swimming Canada/PSO sanctioned competitions, whether taken by a professional photographer or videographer, spectator, team support staff or any other participant, must observe generally accepted standards of decency. Under no circumstances are cameras or other recording devices allowed in the area immediately behind the starting blocks during practice or competition starts, or in locker rooms, bathrooms, or any other dressing area.

- c. Only individuals that have made application and received authorization to record the event in any manner, in any medium or context now known or hereafter developed, shall be granted access to the designated deck area and permission to do so. Please contact Meet Management for application and authorization.

**Facility Rules:**

Proper footwear and clothing must be worn throughout the building (outside pool area). No outdoor footwear is allowed on deck. All swimmers must shower before entering pool. In case of a building emergency (power failure, etc.) swimmers are asked to clear the pool immediately and exit the building. All coaches shall meet in a designated area with the meet management for further instructions. Bell Aliant lifeguards will be on duty. The leisure pool will be available for warm-up and cool-down. The hot tub is strictly off-limits. ***In respect of those with allergies, please note that the meet will be peanut and nut free.***

**Coaches:**

All coaches must be registered with CSCA. The CSCA certification card will be required for deck access and should be visible on the deck.

**Officials:**

Qualified officials from all clubs are necessary to help ensure an efficient swim meet. Please send officials and timers names along with preferred position(s) and session(s) to the Officials Coordinator at [amberlt@outlook.com](mailto:amberlt@outlook.com).

Officials briefing will be convened during the warm-up of each session in the Multi-Purpose Room off the pool deck.

Safety Marshalls will be selected from the list of officials who sign up to volunteer and will need to arrive 10 minutes before the start of warm-up of each session.

**Spectators:** The viewing deck will be available for spectators. Spectators are not permitted on the pool deck. Should you require- accommodation for viewing because the viewing deck is not accessible, please contact meet management.
